

Due to emergency closures, our Junior Infants missed 40 school days. Our Senior Infants, missed another 61 days last year. That's 101 days out of 366 days in total! That is huge and no one is minimising the impact this must have. We could spend time speculating about where our children should be if it wasn't for the lockdowns etc. but let's meet them where they are. They are doing incredibly well in the face of such adversity and I have no doubt they will have developed resilience that previous generations did not have to develop! All of the children have worked hard this year so enjoy the long summer days and fill them with fun and laughter and rest (if you can!). We will see you all in September, bright and ready to learn for our new school year!

## **Workbooks & Booklists**

In the early part of this century, there had been a move away from more traditional forms as education such as textbooks, in favour of more active learning and bespoke teacher made resources. For example, in year 1 of our school the pupils used only one workbook. The guidelines for reopening schools and the possibility of remote learning led to a greater emphasis on workbooks/ textbooks for our year 2. You will notice, when the books go home that not all the textbooks will be fully completed. This does not reflect that work was not done but that active learning was done instead! Usually at this time of year, we send the booklist for the upcoming year. However, we have decided to see if there are any updated guidelines from the department during the summer months which in turn may lead to changes to our booklist/materials etc. We will do our best to keep the cost for books/resources etc. to €100 approx. (there might be a few euro less or more depending on your child's class.)

We will be reopening in Sharkey Hill Community Centre on September 1st 2021, unless we hear otherwise during the holidays! Please note that it is highly likely the school will move premises, at some stage, during the next school year (2021-22). Unfortunately, this is unavoidable in the current circumstances and though disappointing, it is part and parcel of life in new and developing schools. We will do everything possible to ensure that disruptions to your child's schooling are kept to a minimum.


